Richard Bosworth

Richard Bosworth brings to the concert stage a broad spectrum of musical tastes and experience. His travels have taken him to nearly every major continent as recitalist, soloist, chamber musician, recording artist and competitor. He is a champion of contemporary works, often premiering them at convention workshops.

He gave a guest performance at the White House in 1999, and in 2005 he debuted the first interactive music program to combine internet resources and multi-media at Lincoln Center. Most recently, in January of this year, he performed for the Pianoforte Foundation in Chicago. Videos of many of his performances may be found on YouTube. Richard Bosworth makes his home in Naples, Florida.

James Campbell

James Campbell has performed solo and chamber music concerts in 30 countries, has been soloist with over 60 orchestras, including the Boston Pops and the London Symphony, and has soloed with 30 string quartets, including the Amadeus and Guarneri.

His 40 recordings include two of the Debussy Rhapsody. His recording of the Brahms Clarinet Quintet was chosen by the BBC and London Times as the best available. Numerous awards include Canada's "Artist of the Year" and that country's highest honor, "The Order of Canada."

He has been Professor of Music at the music school at Indiana University since 1988 and Artistic Director of Festival of the Sound since 1985.
